





Sons and Daughters In Touch (SDIT) is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization established in **1989** to locate, unite and support the **Gold Star Sons and Daughters** of American servicemen who were killed - or remain missing - while serving in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

SDIT envisions a future where the lessons of previous wars help provide better care, support and understanding for **Gold Star Families**. That's why we actively:

- Secure government-provided wellness services for members
- Facilitate groundbreaking research to document the **Gold Star Child** experience
- Utilize social media to foster ongoing peer support and resilience among members
- Advocate for federal and state legislation benefiting **Gold Star Families**
- Honor our fathers and all veterans at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial
- Partner with Veteran and Military Service Organizations to educate and serve the national **Gold Star Family** community

GOLD STAR HISTORY

10 US Code § 1126 instructs the Secretary of Defense to award the **Gold Star Lapel Button** as an identifying symbol to the widow(er), each parent, sibling and child of members of the US Armed Forces who lose their lives while engaged in action against an enemy of the United States; or while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force; or while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict.

After US combat forces left Vietnam on March 28, 1973, the instruction was expanded to include the immediate families of those who lose their lives as a result of an international terrorist attack against the United States or a foreign nation friendly to the United States, or in military operations while serving outside the United States as part of a peacekeeping force.



2022 IMPACT HIGHLIGHTS

↓ MARCH

- Commemorated the 5th Anniversary of National Vietnam War Veterans Day (March 29) in a solemn ceremony with military leaders from the Pentagon, and Vietnam Veterans of America at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial
- Held a regional gathering in Washington, DC hosted by the Gary Sinise Foundation



MAY ↓

- On Memorial Day, SDIT members Denise Reed and Jill Hubbs joined President Biden and First Lady Dr. Jill Biden to plant a Gold Star Families Tree at the White House, and SDIT members placed a wreath at The Wall from all SDIT members
- In partnership with the Paramount Veterans Network, nearly



100 members and their families attended screenings of the blockbuster film *Top Gun: Maverick* in New York and Los Angeles. In *Top Gun* and in *Maverick*, Tom Cruise portrays Naval Aviator Pete 'Maverick' Mitchell, a Gold Star Son from the Vietnam War

- MIA Daughter Cindy Stonebraker and Richard Petty teamed up to bring POW/MIA awareness to NASCAR for the Coca-Cola 600 at the Charlotte Motor Speedway.



↓ JUNE



- On behalf of the estimated 20,000 Gold Star Children from the Vietnam War, SDIT placed a wreath and messages at the Wall on Father's Day
- Scores of members joined the Woody Williams Foundation to attend the dedication of Gold Star Families Memorial Monuments across the nation



↓ AUGUST



- Aided the US Senate in drafting the Gold Star Children's Day Resolution designating August 1 to honor America's Gold Star Children for their sacrifices.

↓ NOVEMBER

- Arranged NFL 'Salute to Service' tributes with the Baltimore Ravens, Buffalo Bills, Indianapolis Colts, Los Angeles Chargers, Minnesota Vikings and Tampa Bay Buccaneers to honor SDIT's Gold Star and POW/MIA Families
- Honoring the 40th Anniversary of The Wall and their fathers remembered there, SDIT members helped read aloud all 58,281 names. More than 100 SDIT members and their families attended the national Veterans Day ceremony at The Wall.
- Organized a Veterans Day 'meet and greet' reception for SDIT members and their families in Arlington, VA, hosted by the Gary Sinise Foundation
- 40 SDIT members braved the rain to attend the annual Veterans Day ceremony in Arlington National Cemetery which was hosted this year by Vietnam Veterans of America
- 25 SDIT members representing every region of the US attended the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund's 'Lifetime Service Award Gala' on November 11



SEPTEMBER ↓

- Supported National POW/MIA Recognition Day on September 17
- Assembled representatives of 'The Long Gold Line' - Gold Star family members from WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War and the Global War on Terror - to thank the US Senate for declaring the last week of September 'Gold Star Families Remembrance Week'



DECEMBER ↓

- Arranged for 25 SDIT Family members to attend the White House Holiday Open House for Gold Star & POW/MIA Families
- Helped plan the Richard Nixon Presidential Library's 'Hometown Heroes' ceremony honoring 'The Long Gold Line' of Gold Star Families
- Collaborated with the White House to honor 15 SDIT families with personalized ornaments placed on the Gold Star Christmas Trees
- SDIT members were again integral in placing and decorating the Christmas Tree at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial
- On December 28, SDIT families were hosted by the Woody Williams Foundation at the Liberty Bowl college football game in Memphis, TN

OUR MISSION

The Mission of Sons and Daughters In Touch (SDIT) is to locate, unite and support the Gold Star 'sons and daughters' of American servicemen Killed or Missing in the Vietnam War.

OUR HISTORY

SDIT was formed in 1989 to fill a void and help answer life-long questions held by the children of American servicemen who were lost in the Vietnam War.

Since inception, SDIT has been instrumental in providing outreach, education and support to our members through opportunities including national Father's Day gatherings at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, bereavement workshops, leading the largest-ever Gold Star Family pilgrimage to Vietnam and forging partnerships with Gold Star Families from before and after the Vietnam War.

OUR FATHERS

Our fathers hailed from all 50 states and US territories. They served at every rank in each branch of the US military, fought in every battle and received every possible commendation during the war. They are now remembered on every panel of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial.



THE SDIT IMPACT

THE LONG GOLD LINE

90% of America's Gold Star Families lost loved ones in wars and conflicts occurring before 2001. Today, 'The Long Gold Line' includes a few surviving Gold Star Children from WWI and Gold Star Families of those lost in WWII, the Korean War, Vietnam War, Persian Gulf War and the Global War on Terror. SDIT recently supported the development of a Census Survey for WWII and Korean War Gold Star Families.

SDIT continues an historic 30-year partnership with Vietnam Veterans of America to promote mutual exchange and healing between the warrior and the children of his fallen comrade.

The 11th Annual Hometown Heroes celebration at the Richard Nixon Presidential Library in California saluted 65 Gold Star Families whose loved ones were lost from WWII to the final days in Afghanistan.

WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER

SDIT ADVOCACY

All SDIT Members benefit from our public awareness and advocacy efforts on Capitol Hill and with the Executive Branch of Government. In 2021, SDIT supported several legislative efforts providing benefits and job opportunities for its members. **We were proud to be among the leading voices to establish Gold Star Children's Day on August 1, 2021.** We also advocated for bills that would provide Gold Star Family members a hiring preference in federal job applications; enable Gold Star Family members to utilize space-available seating on military flights, and to have the US Postal Service re-issue the Gold Star Families postage stamp.

SDIT promoted the new Congressional Gold Star Families Fellowship Program by sharing application information and insights to more than 100 members. Four SDIT members are actively serving as Fellows in California, Pennsylvania and Washington.

As an Honorary Commemorative Partner, SDIT is helping the Vietnam War Commemoration mark the 50th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War by coordinating the presentation of honors to Vietnam veterans and Gold Star Families from the Vietnam War.



SDIT supported the National League of POW/MIA Families' efforts to return the POW/MIA Flag atop the White House and to share personal stories promoting the fullest possible accounting for our nation's 1,584 unreturned Vietnam Veterans.



SDIT helped establish and dedicate Gold Star Family Memorial Monuments now in every state - with several SDIT members serving as the Gold Star Family representative on the local advisory boards developing the Memorials.



SDIT commemorated National Vietnam War Veterans Day, Memorial Day, Father's Day, National POW/MIA Recognition Day and Veterans Day with the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, contributed stories for 'What the Wall Means to Me' campaign and supported the Reading of the Names to launch the 40th Anniversary of the Memorial on Veterans Day 2022.



- **5,000 connections made** through Quarterly Zoom Meetings, eUpdates and a new YouTube Channel.
- **Over 1,000 Gold Star and POW/MIA Families** receive ongoing support through a Private Facebook community.
- Connected **more than 500 Gold Star Children** to benefits and honors including their Gold Star Lapel Buttons and Certificate from the Vietnam War 50th Commemoration Commission.
- Over the 2021 Holidays, **25 SDIT families** were proud to have their loved one honored on the White House Gold Star Tree.
